

Timeline of American Quilt History

Quilting in early America was far different than it is now. Over the years methods changed from piecing and quilting being done by hand to the use of the sewing machine and finally to the use of modern sewing and quilting machines. Listed below is a timeline of major trends in quilting in our country since 1750.

- Whole Cloth...1750-1850
- Chintz Appliqué...1775-1865
- Pieced Patchwork...1780-present

- Establishment of US Textile Mills...1813-1840
- Baltimore Album Style...1840-1900
- Friendship Blocks...1840-1900s
- Early Sewing Machines...1845-1855
- Published Patterns...1855—present
- Civil War Quilting...1861-1865
- Charm Quilts...1870-1950
- Crazy Quilts...1880-1910
- Establishment of Quilt Guilds...1920-1970
- Feed sacks...1925-1940
- Rotary Cutters...1979-present
