

President Sue Johnson called the meeting to order at 1:15pm at the Oakhurst Community Center Pavilion followed by the flag salute. Sue thanked members who brought refreshments and recognized birthday and anniversary folks.

Sara McEntire, Oakhurst Public Library - Summer Sewing for Kids. Program for middle grade students to learn to sew. Ten to 15 students but Sara wants 15 volunteers as students need one-on-one instruction. Volunteers must complete an application for liability except if they did this in the past two years. Tentatively July 16 - 18, 2024 for 1 1/2 hour per day. Volunteers will supply their own sewing machines.

- From the Art Quilters Meeting: An art quilt is an original work and may be non-traditional with the emphasis on design. It does not use patterns or kits.

The Quilt Show Committee met on Friday, March 8th.


Postcards are now available for all members. Betsy Blum did a beautiful job putting those together.


