It is not too early to get your quilts entered into our 2023 Quilt Show. Each member may enter as many as 4 quilts - three quilts in the wall • hanging/small/medium/large category and one mini quilt 18 x 18 or smaller. Medium and Large Quilts will require a 4-inch sleeve on the back for hanging. Fill out an application for each entry. The online guilt entry form can be found on our SMQA website or by clicking here. More details can be found on the form. Keep in mind that April 7, 2023 is the last day for quilt entries. A quilt does not need to be completely finished to enter it. • However, Kay will need to know the finished size of your quilt when it is entered. Therefore, the finished quilt size is mandatory on all entry forms to be eligible for acceptance in the Quilt Show. Finished quilts are due May 15 and 16 and are to be dropped off at the library from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Please enter as soon as possible to help the • committee process the information needed. We can't wait to see what you've been working on . since our last Quilt Show.

Spring cleaning time is just around the corner. Here are five tips on how to declutter your sewing room.

1. Name What Matters

Before getting started take a bit of time to think about what you really love and want to keep. If you focus on what you love before you begin your decluttering process, it will be easier to make decisions about what to get rid of.

2. Gather Supplies

Start by gathering a donate box or bag and a trash bag if needed. Without a donate box readily available it's easy to just shift things around and decide to keep everything (this has happened)!

3. Use the "Container Principle"

Our boxes and bins, shelves, drawers, and even our houses are actually containers and can only hold so much. Once you realize this principle, it makes it easier to recognize that there might not be room to keep everything you currently have if you want any semblance of order.

4. Decide Once

As you begin to sort through your fabrics and supplies you have only two decisions to make: keep or get rid of it. Don't allow yourself to have a "maybe" box. And only keep what you can reasonably store in the space you have available. Refer to tip #1 when in doubt—if you don't love it, yoù probably won't use it in a quilt in the near future.

5. Donate

The best and easiest way to get rid of fabrics, sewing supplies, notions, unused patterns, books, and gadgets is to donate. While there might be some things you have that you might want to sell—it's often so time-consuming to sell that you end up never getting rid of it. There are lots of places to donate:

- Quilt guilds readily accept fabrics and notions for their projects and charitable sewing groups.
- Libraries may be willing to take quilting books.
- Reach out to local schools and senior centers.
- Donate to a local thrift store.
- Consider gifting fabrics to a Quilts of Valor organization.

Let's do what we can to help our men and women feel appreciated. They have given so much and need to know that the American people do care and are thankful to them. 
